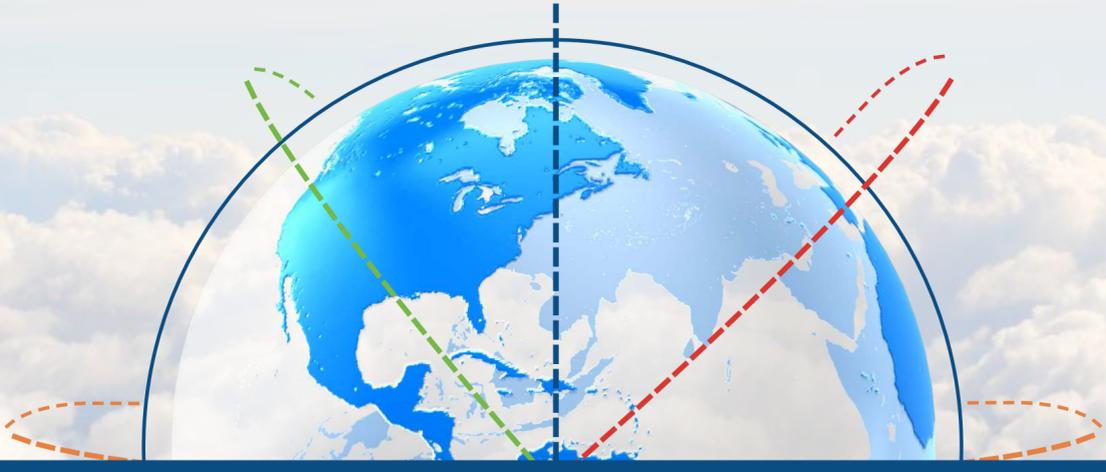


THE CLOUD-OUTSOURCING RELATIONSHIP
